



□ Center Information

Chungcheongnam-do Safety Experience Center has a large building with 4 ground floors in the floor area of 5,975m² which offers a variety of safety experience facilities for visitors such as families, students and adults to experience disasters and learn how to overcome those difficulties based on their experience.

The center is committed to increasing public awareness for safety and their ability to cope with emergency situations by providing a total number of 15 experience programs covering fire, rescue, first aid, earthquake, typhoon, traffic accident and flooding.

Traffic Information

From Cheonan Station Taxi: Get a taxi at the taxi stand (taking about 15 minutes)
 Bus: Take buses No. 51 & 52 → Get off at Ligak Museum of Art
 (Buses stop in front of the Industrial Bank of Korea branch on the opposite side of Cheonan Station, operating with an interval of 1 hour and taking about 20 minutes to the center)


Take a taxi at the bus terminal: Get a taxi at the taxi stand (taking about 10 minutes)
 Bus: Take buses No. 51 & 52 → Get off at Ligak Museum of Art
 (Buses stop at the bus platform in front of the terminal, taking about 35 minutes)

Children Experience Hall

Children can experience various types of indoor and outdoor safety accidents with plays to increase their ability to cope with emergency situations. The hall offers indoor safety, fire safety and walking traffic safety education programs.



Regular Exhibition

The hall provides overall information about disasters to increase public awareness by examples of disaster accidents in Korea and other countries and improve their ability to cope with such disasters.

4D Theater

3D visual images with special effects increase public awareness for safety.



Skyscraper Fire Exhibition Hall

Participants can learn how to prevent fire in high-rise buildings, what they should do in case of fire and how to use rescue ladders (connected to the 3rd floor).




Orientation Hall

Participants are introduced to the experience halls and learn cautions.



Metrorail Accident Experience Hall

Participants can experience urban railway fire accident and learn how to use emergency facilities and evacuate and how to wear air respirators, gas helmets and masks.

Typhoon Experience Hall

Participants are informed about and experience typhoons and rain storms to learn how to prevent damages and cope with such disasters.

Water Safe Experience Hall

Participants are informed about and experience water safe accidents to learn safety measures against such disasters.

Traffic Accident Experience Hall

Participants can learn safety rules for road traffics and ride a bus simulator to experience virtual traffic accidents and learn how to cope with such accidents.

Indoor Fire Experience Hall

Participants can learn how to use fire extinguishers, escape from fire and use rescue equipment to improve their ability to cope with indoor fire and extinguish it in earlier stages.

Earthquake Experience Hall

Participants can learn about earthquake, how to cope with earthquake in the magnitude of 7.0 or higher on the Richter scale, and experience evacuation in the blackout and escape from collapses.

Bush Fire and Landslide Experience Hall

Participants can learn about risks of Bush fire and landslide and how to prevent damages and cope with such disasters.

Infectious Disease Experience Hall

Participants can learn how to prevent and cope with infectious diseases.

CBR Experience Hall

Participants can learn about chemical, biological and radiological pollutions and safety measures such as wearing gas masks.

First Aid Practice Hall

Participants can use mannequins to learn cardiopulmonary resuscitation and other important first aids.

Firefighting Practice Hall

Participants can understand how to operate various firefighting facilities by organized practices for those facilities.
